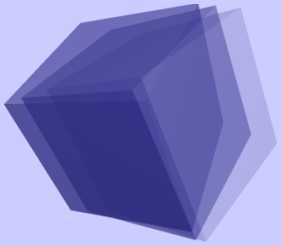

Information Sharing Arrangement Specific Recommendation
- ❖ **Trust vs. Rule Based Operation**
- ❖ **Activity is Core**: It makes the arrangement to work
- ❖ Creating an **“Enabling Environment”**
- ❖ **Multi Stakeholder Setup** (including governments and suppliers)

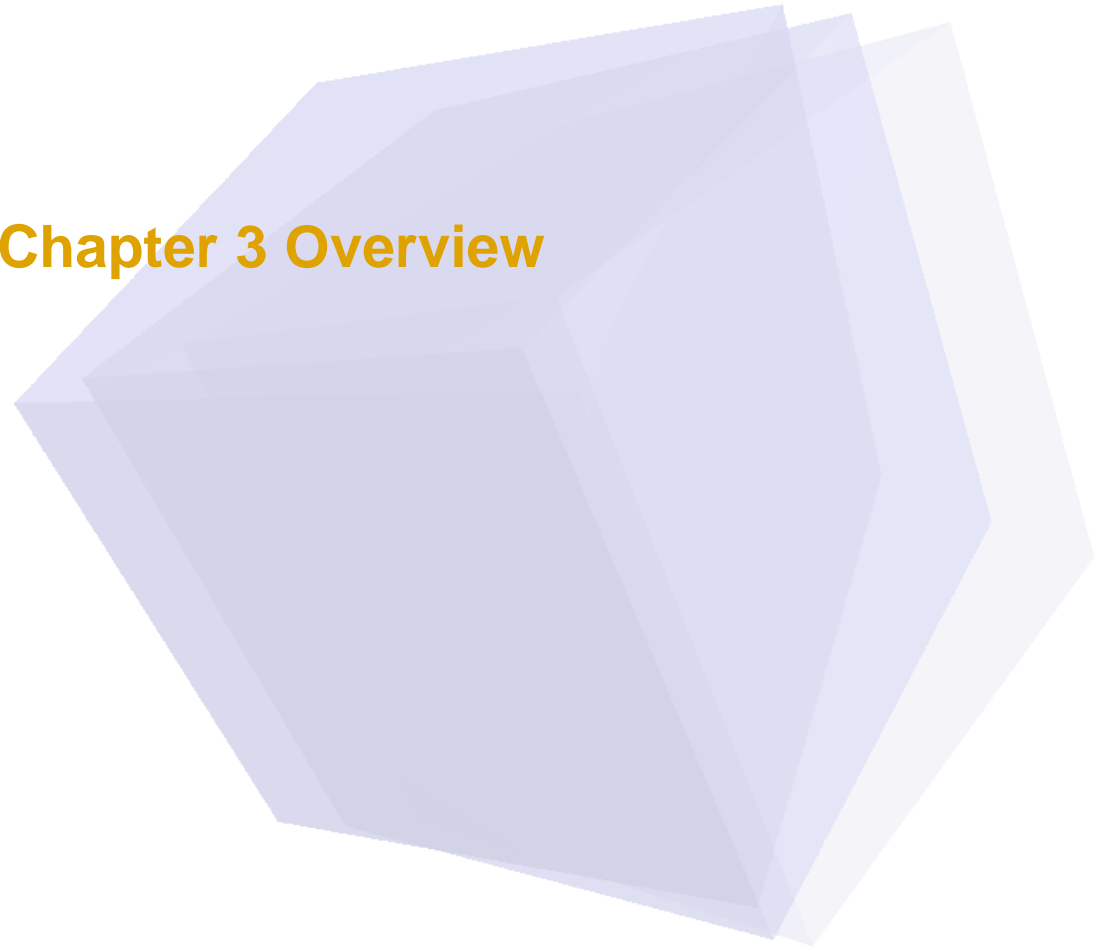

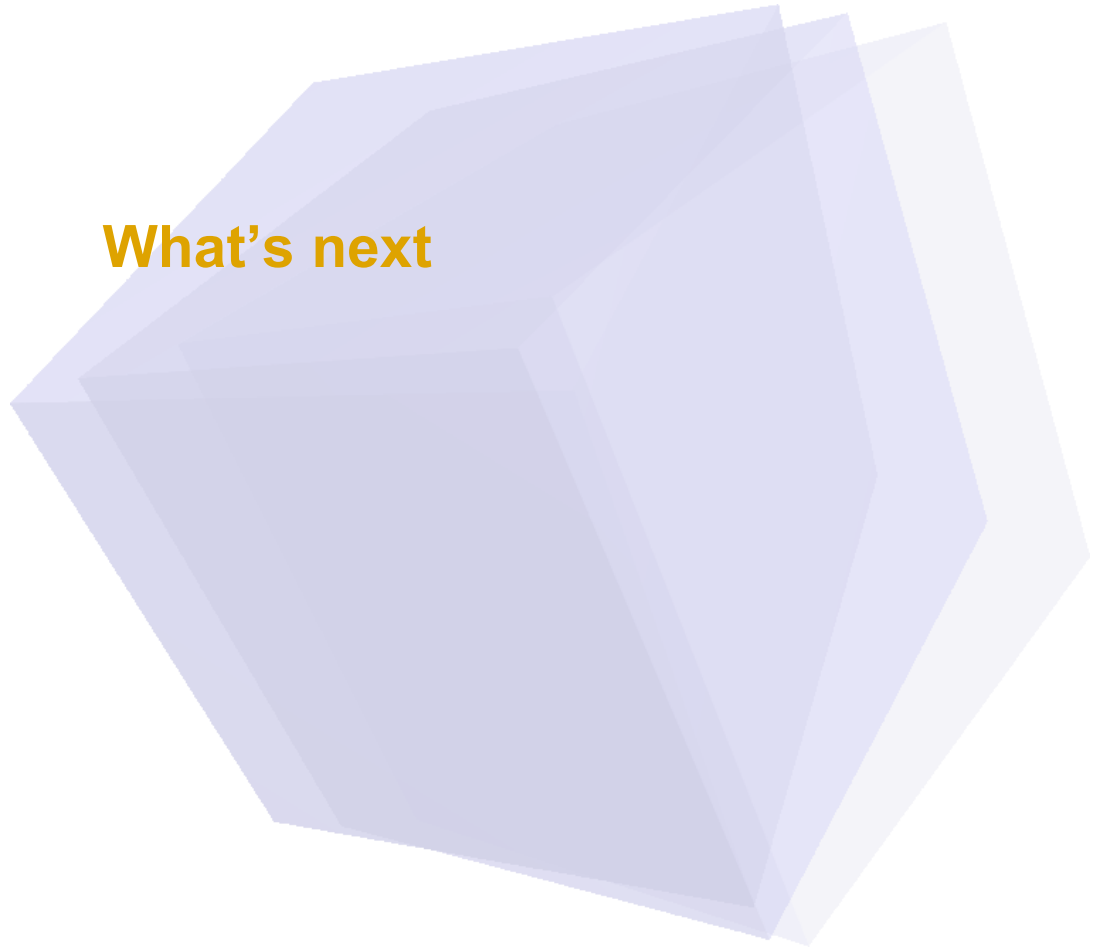
